Please congratulate both pupils when you see them. Thank you all for your hard work and setting high expectations. Or wouldn't be possible without you.




### **Good News from Year 9**

Year 9 have had a fantastic start to the year and are enjoying the return to normality. They are thriving in their optional subjects and really enjoying getting a feel for their GCSE courses. ### **Computer Science**

Year 9 pupils have been enjoying bringing their learning to life through the practical experience of seeing some of the internal parts of a computer. The pupils were amazed to see some of the parts they do not normally get to see as they are hidden away in the computer casing - such as the heat sink, motherboard, the CPU and the power supply. ## **Dance**

Despite a very turbulent year, St Matthew Academy's talented young dancers have worked extremely hard to raise the profile of dance both in and beyond school. Undeterred by the many Covid restrictions in place between 2020 and 2021, they enjoyed many enriching experiences to support their development as choreographers and performers.

In October last year, Year 7 and 8 pupils benefitted from participating in a series of exciting dance workshops led by Samantha Felton, a dynamic and inspiring young dancer studying for her BA in Dance at Trinity Laban, a globally renowned dance Conservatoire in Deptford. The workshops were designed to engage and broaden the experiences of young dancers with aptitude in a fun and creative learning environment.

Later in the term, Year 8 Gifted and Talented dancers worked hard to produce a thought-provoking dance film, which was aired as part of the 2021 Lewisham Live festival, an annual celebration bringing together artistic talent from across the borough. The piece was based on Alvin Ailey's "We Dance" choreography, which draws attention to the importance of the Black Lives Matter campaign, focusing on how the power of the Arts, including Dance, can empower people of colour.

In January, Year 8 pupils from across Dance and Music began working alongside professional dancers and musicians from Trinity Laban as part of the 2021 Live at Trinity Laban festival. This highly funded project began online and culminated in an original piece of dance accompanied by exciting musical composition. In addition, the creation process has become the subject of an insightful documentary, produced by Trinity Laban, due to be aired during the Autumn term. The work showcases the immense talents within the school and gave the pupils a chance to develop and grow in confidence both personally and within the art form.

Last year's Innovation Days were a highlight of the school's calendar and provided our young dancers with the chance to experience working alongside professionals from the Royal Academy of Dance.

In spring, pupils enjoyed uplifting street dance workshops and had the opportunity to focus their brains and bodies in an enjoyable, but very physically demanding afternoon of Capoeira with Anetta Zwierzynska. More recently, the Summer Innovation Day enabled pupils from across the Primary and Secondary phase to learn how to apply their creative talents to new disciplines through partaking in a funpacked day of body percussion workshops with Fernando De Morais Machado, a member of the educational group 'Beat Goes On.'

This year, our work with the Royal Academy of Dance is continuing alongside dance practitioner Zoe Elliot, who is currently running weekly creative dance sessions for St Matthew Academy pupils interested in developing their range of creative skills. This opportunity will continue to be available for pupils in the years ahead.

Over the years, many pupils have experienced the benefits of working creatively with the Learning and Participation team at Trinity Laban. Last year was no exception and despite the lockdowns and various restrictions, both our Gifted and Talented Primary pupils and Year 8 dancers were put through their paces through in high energy Contemporary Creative dance workshops led by artists Vicki Bursford and Natalie Dodd, aiming to provide a gateway into the Launch and Centre for Advanced Training schemes at Trinity Laban.





# **Mandela Page**


