I feel extremely proud and honoured to have seen so many pupils successfully move through our school and for me, seeing the progress the children make is what has made it all worthwhile.

While I do feel very sad to be leaving my position as Headteacher, I am so glad that I am able to pass on the responsibility of this most important of jobs to Mr Potter. I know that under his leadership SMA will continue to go from strength to strength. I wish him and all members of the school community every success for the future! Thank you and farewell.
