All year 7 pupils have been having their LRC inductions during their reading lessons where they have been shown how the LRC works, all the books they can borrow and they have had a demonstration of our online reading app Sora which complements our wide range of books in the LRC.

We have also launched our 'Reading Bingo' challenge. Secondary pupils are encouraged to take a 'Reading bingo' card and choose a row of 5 boxes. They then have to read five books which correspond to the 5 boxes they have chosen. Books can be borrowed from the LRC or from Sora.
