Message from the Senior Leadership Team

Our final newsletter of the year gives me an opportunity to reflect on the successes we have enjoyed celebrating and the highlights for staff and pupils alike. It has been a year when we got trips, visits and clubs back to the pre-covid norm. There were two firsts for overseas residential trips — a highly successful Business Studies and Computing visit to France for 40 year 9 and 10 pupils. The trip included a tour of Paris, trips to Euro Disney alongside subject conferences with a range of professionals and experts in their field. The second overseas trip was a first ever ski trip for SMA pupils. Everyone involved had a superb 9 days, made amazing progress on the ski slopes and came home with tales and stories to treasure forever. These trips will be repeated on a bi-annual basis so look out for information next term about the 2024-25 trips- early booking required!

Alongside two overseas residentials, there have been a wide range of other residential activities that you have read about in our newsletter over the last year. These include the Year 6 trip to PCL in Surrey, two Geography field trips to Juniper Hall, an outward-bound experience to the Peak District for a group of year 7s and four DoE expeditions for Year 9 and 10 pupils. What makes staff most proud when leading these trips is the response from our pupils. Their behaviour is always exemplary, they are friendly and polite to everyone and this is always commented on by everyone they meet. Our pupils really do Let Their Light Shine when beyond the school gates! I am pleased that we have been able to offer subsidised places to a number of pupils on these visits – giving them opportunities and experiences they may otherwise not have. We use our SMA Hardship Fund to provide these places – thank you to everyone that has donated to the fund, it really does make a life changing difference to an individual pupil!

The last couple of weeks at SMA have been busy ones and you will get a flavour of what has been going on in the next few pages. The Secondary Awards Evening was a grand affair with a full hall of parents, carers and friends sharing in the celebrations of our prizewinners and we were treated to some amazing performances by our talented musicians, singers and performers. On the same day, we managed to squash in the Annual SMA Summer Fayre! The weather was kind, there was the full range of games, activities and food stalls on offer and fabulous attendance from our primary parents and pupils across the school. 
