Year 10 visited Chelsea FC as part of their GCSE course, "Business of Football Tour." The trip started with a look around the Museum where pupils took shots at the goal, played on PSP football related games and had a look at all the trophies and kit that Chelsea have won and worn through the years. During lunch we watched a film about Chelsea and how the stadium was the oldest in the world and the club had been around since 1905.





After lunch we took a tour of the stadium - first stop was a look at where the media watch the game and the media suite. Pupils were invited to practice their commentating skills on the mike, post game as seen on TV. Pupils completed a booklet and discussions were centred on sponsorship and its worth.
