Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to a new academic term at St Matthew Academy Primary Phase. We hope you had an enjoyable and restful Easter holiday. As your child is now entering their final term of Year 6 there are some key messages we would like to share with you.

Curriculum

This term, our topic is on World War two. We will be exploring lots of different sources of information, both primary and secondary to understand fully the events of the war and the roles that different individuals played within it. We will be researching how the local area was impacted by the war and exploring the area practically. At the end of the summer term, there will be a number of events to mark the end of the children's primary school journey. Please look out for more information about each of these events in due course. Although the national SATs examinations have been cancelled for this year, we will still be carrying out robust assessment to ensure that children go to Secondary school with an accurate assessment of their abilities.

Homework

Homework will be set each Friday with the expectation that it is handed in the following Thursday morning. The purpose of homework is to provide the children with the opportunity to consolidate and extend the learning that has taken place that week in class. It is essential that homework is completed as it will be marked in class collaboratively every Friday afternoon. Each child will receive a comprehension activity, maths homework and spellings on a weekly basis. We expect all children to read for at least 20 minutes each evening, practise their spellings and times tables. Children will also receive 2 pieces of RE homework during the half term and a topic based project which they can present in a way of their choosing, allowing opportunities to pursue personal subjects of interest; science, art, music, drama, ICT.

Weekly activities

Children will be expected to travel to school in their full PE kit for their PE days, they will remain in their kit throughout the school day.

Expectations

Children to arrive by 8.50am in full school uniform ready to start their learning.
