EYFS Curriculum Newsletter – Summer 2020

Dear Parent/Carers,

Welcome back to the final term of your children's first year at St Matthew Academy! Please find information about our topics and class expectations below.

Curriculum

For the first half term, the children will be learning through our topic- Traditional Tales/Paw and claws. Within this, we will be exploring the different types of animals and their features using traditional tales for a familiar point of reference. We will name and label the different parts of common animals. We will also be looking at life cycles and keeping butterflies and chicks to observe the lifecycles in real life. We hope to be able to use the Forest School for further learning in this subject once the necessary repairs have been completed.

Weekly Activities

PE will continue for Bumblebees on Mondays and Ladybirds on Tuesdays. Please ensure your child comes to school in their **full St Matthew Academy PE kit**.

Library – due to the COVID-19 crisis, we will be unable to take the children to the library. However, there will be a good selection of books to choose from in our class reading area. After School Provision – will be confirmed and further information will be provided closer to the time.

Homework

Homework will be set every Friday with the expectation that it is returned on the following Wednesday. Homework will include a set of weekly spellings which will be tested the following Friday, one piece of reading and one piece of maths. We will also occasionally set a writing task. Please try to allow your child to complete their homework as independently as possible.

Any comments regarding your children's participation in their homework will be appreciated.

Any photos of interesting animals they come across are also most welcome! It will be due on **Friday 7th May 2021.**
