Prayer and Reflection

The Feast of Corpus Christi, Latin for the Body of Christ, was first instituted in 1264 by Pope Urban the IV, in a town called Orvieto, Central Italy following the experience of another member of the clergy. A German priest who was going through hard times started to doubt the mystery of the Eucharist and under guidance from his Confessor, set off on pilgrimage from his village, to Rome, to visit the tombs of the apostles. During his travels he continued to contemplate on the mystery of the Eucharist and on the last part of his journey he stopped in a small town called Bolsena and celebrated mass there. It was here, during the mass he received confirmation and answers to his doubts and uncertainties when the consecrated host, which was already the real flesh and blood of Christ, changed its appearance from that of bread and wine to that of real flesh and blood of Christ.

The Church teaches us that Jesus' body blood soul and divinity is substantially present in the Eucharist. Jesus himself says this to us in the gospels when he says "This is my body... This is my blood." The gospel reading for Sunday tells the story of Jesus feeding the 5000 with five loaves and two fish. Jesus, with the help of his disciples, freely offered the 5000 food to nourish their bodies. This was an act of real and true faith on the part of the disciples to follow his instructions and believe that he could truly feed everyone. This is re-enacted every time we go to Mass as Jesus' whole self is present when we receive the Eucharist. Just like the disciples, we must have faith that Jesus is present in the Holy Eucharist. In transubstantiation he not only offers us unconditional nourishment for our bodies but also our souls that our lives may be united to his.

Geography

Our Year 11's have began their Geography exams. Initial responses from the pupils seem to be very positive and upbeat, with several predictions about the longer 8 questions being correct. Pupils seem to be very optimistic!!

Year 9 pupils have received feedback from their ranking exams, and overall it looks very promising Not only did the students perform well, but they enjoyed the exam which was structured like a GCSE paper, and involved different styles of questions from the different components.

Finally Year 7's have been taking their learning outside the classroom and getting out-and-about with Microclimate investigations (picture attached) by measuring temperature, precipitation and wind direction. Pupils have really enjoyed this part of the 'Weather & Climate' unit, and will consolidate their learning with an investigative write-up that strengthens cross-curricular links and develops important skills for the future.

Mandarin Provision

We were very excited in October 2021 to enrol a new cohort of Year 7

students and this year has proved to be very successful with our pupils making very good progress with their native speaker teacher.

I am very pleased to announce that the provision of Mandarin will continue for Y7 students into Y8 and also for 2022 Y7 cohort. The courses are fully aligned to school curriculum and are combined with cultural studies, giving students invaluable cultural knowledge and awareness while simultaneously advancing their language skills. This will allow SMA students to access cultural events offered by the Confucius Institute London, the cultural arm of the Chinese Embassy.

The Stephan Spender Prize

The Stephen Spender Prize is an annual competition for poetry in translation, with categories for students of all ages (14-and-under, 16-and-under and 18-and-under). Entrants are invited to translate any poem from a range of languages (into English, and write a short commentary about it.

Alongside the multilingual main prize, this year there is a special language focus with the Romanian Spotlight. The Spotlight prize is also open to pupils of all ages, with categories at 18-and-under, 14and-under and 10-and-under.

2 SMA students were commended for the Prize in 2021-2022 and this year we hope to enter as many students as possible from Y8 and Y9 classes. Also we have invited our Community Language speakers to take part!
