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Message and revision tips from Ms Migon

Dear year 7,

The second round of ranking exams is fast approaching and I would like to share few tips with you on how to revise. To do well, aim high.



Start revising early, the more you prepare the more confidence you will have in the exam. Do not leave the difficult topics until the end of your revision time.

Check what topics to revise. You want to learn the correct information.

Don't distract yourself with your phone, or a tablet. No social media!

There is no "right way" to revise – different methods suit different people. You may want to mix methods as variety will help you concentrate for longer.

Make posters with key facts then display these in your house where you will see them.

Create Mind Maps with the subject in the centre and key words/pictures linking it.

Record yourself reading notes to listen to on the move. Include questions, a pause and then answers so you can test yourself as you listen.

Study with a friend and test each other's knowledge, but remember you are meeting to revise rather than to chat!

Don't forget to reward your hard work with things you enjoy. Take breaks. Short blocks may be better for you than a solid three hours if nothing goes in!

And if in doubt, ask your teacher.

Behaviour in Examinations

You **MUST** come prepared with all equipment:

- 2 Black Pens
- 2 Sharpened HB Pencils
- 30cm Ruler, protractor, compass
- Clear Pencil Case
- Calculator (Maths/Science)

In the examination room, you **MUST** be silent.

1. You **MUST** be on time for all your examinations.



- 2. You **MUST NOT** become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice in any part of the examination.
- 3. You MUST NOT:
 - Sit an examination in the name of another candidate
 - Have in your possession any unauthorised material or equipment which may give you an unfair advantage
- 4. **Possession of a mobile phone** or any other unauthorised material **is breaking the rules,** even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification.
