Dear Parents and Carers

First of all, we hope this letter meets you well as we remain in these exceptional times. Ms Cefai and I would personally like to thank you all for helping to support the staff at St Matthew Academy over the course of this term.

We would like to take this opportunity to inform you of a number of changes we are making to start and finish times for pupils at the Academy particularly in Year 10. Since the resumption of schools in September, we have been following a strict and rigorous risk assessment, which we are continually evaluating. We now feel we are in a position to start to align the school day for all pupils - this will support parents and older siblings with drop off and pick up; in the secondary phase allow us to start the day with form time/assembly for all pupils and also enable us to bring back more intervention, enrichment and extra-curricular activities. The table indicates the start and finish times and the line-up and lunch time arrangements for Year 10 we will be adopting from Tuesday 5th January 2021.

Sanctions

Our sanction system will be reinstated from January. The incremental scale for detentions is as follows:

- 1 Behaviour Point in the day = Form Tutor Detention (20 minutes)
- 2 Behaviour Points in the day = Centralised Detention (1 hour)
- 3 Behaviour Points in the week = Friday SLT Detention (2 hours)
- 4+ Behaviour Points in the week = Saturday Detention (8.40-11.40)
- Missed Saturday Detention = BSR for 1 day

Uniform

We have been impressed by the way, in which pupils have worn their uniform with pride including the wearing of lanyards. Moreover, pupils have demonstrated great commitment to their learning, highlighted in the lessons we have observed and their resilience shown in light of the current day structure and adaptations to the wider school life. We encourage you to commend your child.

However, I would like to take this opportunity to reiterate our uniform expectations at St Matthew Academy. These expectations are in place to ensure that uniform does not become a distraction from learning and that pupils at St Matthew Academy, take pride in themselves and their school:

- Black shoes not boots for all pupils
- Tailored trousers or SMA kilts for girls
- Black or blue coats without insignia for all pupils
- Lanyards and ID badges (these can be purchased for £3.00 in the event they are lost) for all pupils
- SMA face coverings (these can be purchased for £1.00 in the event they are lost) for all pupils

Successes

Year 10 have transitioned extremely well from such a long break from school. They display a strong willingness to learn and have applied themselves in a way that can only be admired, after all the changes and new systems put in

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place to protect our children and staff. Pupils have been able to adapt quickly, ensuring teaching and learning is at an all-time high, right at a time were our pupils need support and development the most.

Despite the term being challenging, there have been many successes in Year 10. This includes a number of pupils participating in the KPMG mentoring programme, which focuses on supporting pupils' applications for higher education and the development of life skills that will aid this. Pupils engage in Employability projects to gain an understanding of the knowledge, tools and skills to gain entry to careers and aid in their own sense of employability.

As discussed within the year group, attendance and punctuality are imperative to getting the most out of school and fulfilling the potential of all pupils. The following pupils have shown real dedication to this aspect of their education and have been in school, 100% of the time, since September.

Travelling to and from the Academy and Behaviour in the Community

As Ms Baldwin commented in her letter last week, there have been a number of reports of anti -social behaviour in the local community involving some of our pupils over the last half term. We understand that the vast majority of our pupils follow expectations and behave in a responsible and sensible manner when traveling to and from the Academy. However, there remains a small group of pupils who regularly bring the reputation of the Academy into disrepute due to their poor conduct in the local area; in takeaway shops and on the buses. We expect all pupils in Year 10 to go straight home after school and we remind you that, as in previous years, pupils should not be using Blessington Road as a short cut to Lee High Road. Please ensure that your child is not in Lewisham town centre after 3.45pm. This is of vital importance given the move to Tier 3 restrictions.

As also stated in the recent letter from Ms Baldwin, to prevent unnecessary bus use in the morning secondary pupils will not be permitted to use the bus stop outside the bowling alley in Lewisham as it is only two stops to our site. In the afternoon, pupils may use the bus stop opposite St Joseph's Vale to take the 54 bus to go beyond Lewisham. We encourage all other pupils to walk into Lewisham and not wait for the 89 and 108 buses. We thank you in advance in support regarding this matter.
