Dear Parents and Carers,

Y11 Virtual Parents and Pupils' Meeting:

Instead, we will be holding a virtual event, on the same date, at 5pm. The virtual event will take place via Microsoft Teams and a link to join the virtual meeting will be sent out on the day. Y11 Predicted Grades:

Y11 Sanctions

Y11 detentions take place on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. Thursday detentions are for Y11 pupils who acquire 1 x no homework, and are 1 hour long following their Independent Study period (3.40pm - 4.40pm) Any pupil who fails to complete 2 or more pieces of homework, or acquires 3+ behaviour points will receive a Saturday detention (8.40am - 11.40am.) Detentions on Fridays are for pupils who have acquired 2 x behaviour points, and are 1 hour long following their Independent Study (3.40-4.40.) Lunchtime detention will be utilised for pupils who acquire lates.

SIMs App

Please ensure you are utilising the SIMs app to stay up to date with your child's attendance, positives, behaviour points and more. If you have not already downloaded it, please email VDU@stmatthewacademy.co.uk for an activation link.

Y11 Uniform and Equipment

Please ensure your child has a lanyard; it is a compulsory part of their uniform. Pupils must wear blazers at all times around the building and no trainers are permitted. Please also ensure your child comes to school with the full range of equipment they need, including maths sets and calculators. Y11 Post 16 Pathways

Your child should now be investigating their post-Y11 options carefully.
