


A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM

The goal is to promote reading across the Academy; provide support for all students who have fallen behind with their reading and boost spelling, punctuation and grammar skills, again, across the



On a day of workshops and presentations designed to support staff with delivering quality activities, teachers brought in a favourite book to be photographed reading. These pictures will be used as part of a positive push on raising the profile of reading.

I can also announce the appointment of 2 new staff who will be helping to ensure that the Learning Resource Centre is available to all students before, during and after school for reading and extending learning. From January reading mentors will be working with students in the LRC before and after school, to support them with boosting their reading ages.

We believe that achieving good literacy is the right of everyone: that literacy is crosscurricular and that literacy is everyone's responsibility. Teachers and parents play a vital role in developing pupils' spoken language, reading, writing and vocabulary as integral aspects of the teachina of every subject. Improving literacy standards is fundamental to raising students' selfesteem, confidence and achievement.

The school intends to actively pursue its Literacy Policy by:

Improving the school's management of literacy through target setting linked monitoring and evaluation

- Establishing the importance of literacy across the curriculum by providing advice, training and support to teachers in both Primary and Secondary phases and all subject areas
- Ensuring that Primary and Secondary Literacy Coordinators work closely together to develop continuity of principles and practice
- Giving opportunities for students to develop their literacy skills both within and outside the classroom
- · Reviewing all aspects of teaching and learning to ensure that it is accessible and challenging for all
- Promoting and developing the use of the Learning Resource Centre
- Monitoring the progress of individual students and implementing intervention programmes as necessary
- Developing St Matthew Academy as a readina community in conjunction with parents
