

The article focussed on their experiences of conditions in the trenches on the Western Front.



Spotlight on MFL, Art and Textiles

Key Stage 4

MFL

This term, we celebrated Day of Languages by translating the school prayer into nearly 20 languages to celebrate our language diversity at SMA. Our pupils have also been confidently starting lessons, and sometimes assemblies, with the school prayer in Spanish. We celebrated National Poetry Day by exploring some poems in Spanish and French and Day of the Dead by creating beautiful art work and learning about the traditions of the famous Mexican festival.

Our Year 10 and 11 pupils have continued with their bi-weekly French speaking sessions with our librarian and French speaking assistant Ms Fields to ensure they have one on one support and are confident French speakers.

In Year 11, we have started to look at A-Level material in our Breakfast Club for our linguists who are going to excel at A-Level languages and we cannot wait to hear more about A-Level languages from some of SMA's previous linguists who are now studying French and Spanish at STAC.



Art and Textiles

Year 9 Art and Textiles pupils took part recently in a competition to design the Christmas Cards for the school this year. The Art pupils were inspired by a French artist called Ines Longevial who is famous for her portraiture and use of colour blocking. They researched her painting style and used this to create their own designs in water colour. Some pupils created images of Poinsettia flowers as they are common at this time of year and others designed cards of a more traditional nature.

The Textiles pupils made their own Christmas tree decorations out of felt and found fabrics, inspired by Karen Pleass, which were then photographed to create their card designs. Well done to Edibeth from Art and Jochabed, Shaenah and Kaede from Textiles for their brilliant card designs

Classroom display - Geography


Year 9 are incredibly proud of their Geography homework project on Antartica.
