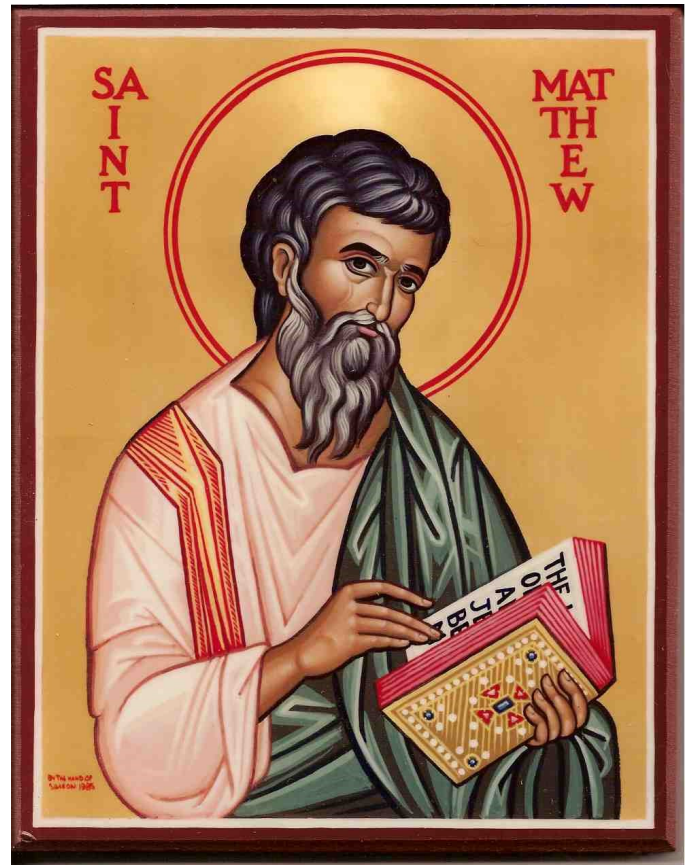

Spotlight on EYFS and Key Stage 1

Our reception classes have fully utilised a holistic approach to motivate their curiosity to learn and explore. Every day they happily access available resources like our writing centre, creative workshop, investigation tables and STEM area.



Children are encouraged to learn naturally and creatively through different learning styles like 'helicopter stories' to recreate an ancient Indian tale about Rama and Sita or STEM activities by constructing The Leaning Tower of Pisa and learning about All Souls' Day through cultural literacy sessions about Felipa and the Day of the Dead.



The EYFS team have taken every opportunity to visit and explore Forest School, looking for leaves and worms. In addition, Ladybirds class have utilised their creativity to access 'maths' everywhere across the provision.



In year one, pupils took part in Circus School to launch their new topic. They performed their own circus acts in the hall. In religious studies lessons They also made their own rainbows following the story of Noah and the Flood.

Spotlight on Key Stage 2

It has been a busy couple of weeks in Key Stage 2 with lots of exciting and interactive learning going on!

In Year 3, they have been doing some hands-on investigating of 'flint knapping' to make Stone Age tools whilst in Year 6, they have been exploring the Gospel Value of Justice in RE with some role play and debating on age restrictions of social media in the English lessons.



This week has also been maths week and the whole phase has been putting their mathematical skills to the test; from planning a 5-star holiday to Turkey (Y6) and budgeting a Luna theme park (Y5) to researching the school's favourite ice-cream (Y3) and investigating numerals and clock faces (Y4).



There has also been an influx of personal success stories today: Taurez in Jaguar class created a wonderful Ludo board celebrating the life of actor Chadwick Boseman for Black History Month, Michaela and Matia in Cheetahs have BOTH managed to get their pen licences this week and Sophia in Tiger class who made a functioning homemade guitar!

Pope Francis' new encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti*

On 4th October, the feast of St Francis Assisi, Pope Francis released his new encyclical *Fratelli Tutti* ("All brothers and sisters")

Fratelli Tutti is a radical challenge, offering a blueprint for a world after coronavirus. It turns the world upside down, placing human dignity at the centre. And it links back to the message of interconnectedness which was also at the heart of *Laudato Si'*.

The Gospel story at the heart of *Fratelli Tutti* is the parable of the Good Samaritan. Jesus's provocative story of the foreigner who acts as a true neighbour to the man robbed and beaten by the side of the road offers the "criterion for judging every economic, political, social and religious project" (FT, 69). This moves us to respond to our sister or brother in need, whoever they are, wherever they may come from (FT, 72). We are challenged to turn outwards, to act as neighbours, and to reach out to all those who are in need.

This encyclical calls for the creation of a new kind of solidarity to tackle the crises the world is currently facing. Pope Francis calls on us all to play our part in building peace, and to focus on becoming a neighbour to others – in particular to welcome migrants, and to resist racism, prejudice and discrimination.

It is clear that we cannot return to the 'old' normal where there were already "dark clouds over a closed world". Instead *Fratelli Tutti* calls us to work together to develop a true understanding of progress.
