# **Job Description**

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### **Main Purpose**

As a reading tutor, you will be responsible for the delivery of effective reading interventions to identified pupils across the secondary phase of the Academy. Ensuring that all pupils can read well is a priority for the Academy and a range of interventions from 'Thinking Reading' to paired reading are in place to ensure this is the case for.

This will include working one to one or in pairs or small groups with pupils to deliver the appropriate intervention. You will be fully supported by the Literacy Coordinator and other staff members providing interventions, including the librarian.

#### **Duties include:**

- Promote a positive learning and reading environment within the Academy
- Become involved with both national literacy strategies such and school wide initiatives; to encourage pupils to read and to use the library as an essential part of the school.
- To be responsible for their own professional development, identifying training needs and requesting courses as appropriate.
- To plan and prepare for the intervention sessions identified for the individual or small groups of pupils.
- To monitor and assess the progress of pupils, keeping accurate records which are shared with the Literacy Co-ordinator
- To deliver the interventions effectively to ensure that all pupils make good progress and ultimately catch up with their reading.
- To undertake all training required to deliver all interventions including the 'Thinking Reading' programme effectively.
- Carrying out any other duties appropriate to the level of the post as required by the Headteacher.

### St Matthew Academy English Department Information



In English, the curriculum is creative, challenging and engaging throughout the secondary phase; pupils enjoy a range of activities linked to reading, writing, speaking and listening, and explore various text types each year. In Year 7 and 8 pupils study units linked to novels, poetry, fiction and non-fiction and plays. This allows pupils to build on previous learning whilst challenging them to investigate and analyse in new ways. Pupils start the GCSE curriculum in Year 10 following the units set out by the AQA examination board. Our priority is to support pupils in developing their skills and knowledge to enable them the chance to make the best possible progress in their GCSE exams, and to ensure that the transition from Key Stage 3 to GCSE is as smooth as possible. As part of the whole school approach to literacy, the English department also offer Sparx reader as a programme to support pupils with their reading and have shared expertise with other departments in the secondary phase, promoting literacy and oracy as key elements of the curriculum in every department.



Pupils are enthusiastic about English, and we offer opportunities for pupils to share their own views and opinions, so that they see the importance of the subject in the wider world. We are proud of our Debate Mate extra-curricular club and we regularly attend/host competitions nationwide, many of which the school have won, and we also perform well in the Jack Petchey Speak Out challenge, with many pupils succeeding in the borough and taking part in regional/national events. World Book Week is a consistent success and a highlight of the school calendar, for the department and the school and we also take part in other events such as the Lewisham Book Awards, which we have hosted in the past.
