## Partial Academy Closure for Years 8 and 9: Thursday 19 March to Friday 20 March inclusive.

I am writing to inform you that the academy will be closed to all pupils in Years 8, and 9 on Thursday 19th March until the end of Friday 20th March in the first instance. This is a result of an unsustainable level of staff shortage due to a significant number of staff self-isolating due to the changed government guidance issued on Monday evening.

In line with government guidance, we have worked hard to keep the academy open for all pupils, but this is now no longer possible. This has been a difficult decision to make. We have prioritised keeping the academy open for pupils who are closest to their GCSE exams and also for our younger pupils in Reception to Year 7. All primary and year 7 pupils are expected to continue to attend the Academy as normal. We will endeavour to keep the academy open for the older year groups for as long as possible.

This is an unprecedented and ever-changing situation. We will keep you updated about next steps. Please regularly check the academy website and Twitter for updates, along with your email and text messages.

Our teachers have organised a variety of home learning tasks for your child to complete in line with the planned curriculum which can be accessed via the link below. Pupils have been reissued with their email address and passwords checked today at school. Please check that your child is able to log in this evening. If they have any difficulties with accessing the log in, or a password has been forgotten, please email your child's full name and tutor group to <a href="mailto:passwordreset@stmatthewacademy.co.uk">passwordreset@stmatthewacademy.co.uk</a>. Please do that this evening or as soon as possible tomorrow.

You should also contact us if your child does not have access to the internet at home so that we can make alternative arrangements for home learning. Please do this either by calling Main Reception or by emailing info@stmatthewacademy.co.uk

Please continue to follow the advice issued by Public Health England in relation to the coronavirus and ensure that your child is fully briefed on their responsibilities related to this. Any pupils who are showing symptoms of either a new persistent cough or a temperature should stay at home. The new guidance currently says that they should self-isolate along with all members of their household.
