## **Dear Parents and Carers**

As you will be aware, on Wednesday 18 March 2020, the government instructed all schools in England to close on the afternoon of Friday 20 March until further notice. No date has been suggested as to when this will change.

I realise that this is both worrying and unsettling news for our Academy community and will cause anxiety for parents, pupils and staff alike. However, I would like to reassure everyone that our staff have been preparing for this announcement and have put in place measures to support our pupils learning at home over the coming weeks. We will also endeavour to continue to ensure that this support remains in place.

Over the course of today and tomorrow, the Senior Leadership Team at the Academy will put in place a plan identifying how we can best support our most vulnerable pupils and those pupils whose parents are key workers in the capital. These workers are likely to include medical, nursing, paramedic and ambulance staff; delivery drivers; workers in adult social care; social workers; teachers; healthcare assistants; administrators in GP surgeries and clinics; certified childminders; nursery staff; fire and police officers and the other groups of children who have been identified to us. These pupils will continue to receive an education provision from Monday 23 March 2020. Key workers who can make alternative childcare arrangements with non-key workers will be expected to do so. If you would like your child to attend the provision the Academy will need to see identification to confirm their eligibility. Please email the Academy at info@stmatthewacademy.co.uk with a photo of your work ID or visit reception by 1.00pm Friday 20 March 2020. Parents <u>MUST</u> not just send their children to the Academy without receiving confirmation that their child is eligible. Please note: a definitive list of key workers will be confirmed by the government on Friday 20 March 2020.

Staff at the Academy can be contacted at any time throughout this period of uncertainty and if you need support or are experiencing hardship please email <u>info@stmatthewacademy.co.uk</u> and staff will do their best to help or assist in any way we can.

For the children of confirmed key workers, the following will apply:

- The building will be open from 8.15am for pupils to receive a breakfast and lunch will also be provided every day -there will be no charge.
- Pupils will be dismissed at 3.00pm
- Pupils may attend in their own clothes if they wish however secondary pupils must wear their lanyards at all times for the purpose of identification
- All pupils should bring clothes/trainers to enable them to take part in PE activities

You will also be aware of the extremely upsetting news that our hardworking Year 11 pupils will not have the opportunity to shine as GCSE examinations have been cancelled. The government says it will work with schools to ensure pupils get the qualifications that they need. As more details are released we will be doing everything we can to help pupils understand what it means for them.
