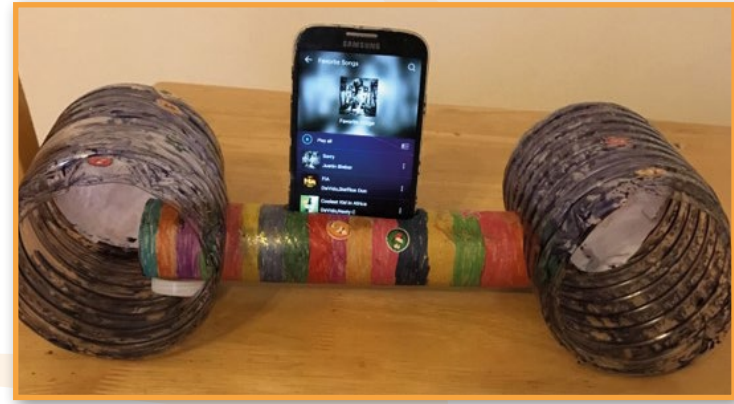


LEARNING AT HOME

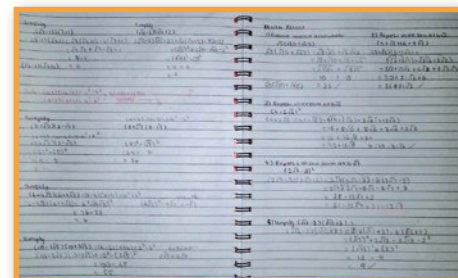
Check out this creative work from Haila in Year 7, she has been looking into sustainable design – great work!

Transition is an integral aspect of our pupil experience. We understand that settling into primary school and progressing from primary to secondary school can be a daunting experience, and we also understand how important it is in the life of a child and their family. As such, we have developed a bespoke programme of events to make the transition period as enjoyable as possible, enabling children to meet their new peers and teachers and familiarise themselves in their new environment, long before their first day.

Our entire staff and pupil community is dedicated to supporting the new cohort of pupils as they embark on their new chapter at St Matthew. We take pride in our nurturing culture and inclusive community that encourages every learner to fulfil their potential, let their light shine and enjoy a happy and successful experience whilst discovering their talents and aspirations.

Unprecedented circumstances forced us to review how we implement our secondary transition programme and this year we introduced 1:1 meetings onsite and via zoom to allow pupils and parents to meet with teachers, and staff to identify pupil strengths and passions, enabling them to harness and develop these skills, whilst getting to know every child as an individual. We look forward to welcoming Year 7 in September for their orientation day.



In July, we welcomed families in for 1:1 interviews with their teachers for a slightly different take on Induction Day.



At the end of term, we celebrated pupils in SMA Primary phase and bid them farewell and good luck in the next stage of their education. Pupils have spent time with their older peers and teachers preparing for secondary school, and we look forward to welcoming many of them back in September to secondary phase.

Celebrating Primary Phase!

EYFS and Early Years Highlights:

In our current EYFS cohort (2020), the percentage of pupils able to achieve a Good Level (GLD) of Development compared to last year, highlighting the hard work of the EYFS team and our robust teacher judgements.

The percentage of pupils passing their phonics screening check in Year 1 has dramatically increased by 16% and this current cohort will be recognised as our highest percentage of pupils in Year 1 to pass the phonics screening check.

Our results for this cohort place us in-line with the previous academic year (2019) national percentage of pupils who were able to pass the phonics screening check.

Key Stage 2

The percentage of Year 6 pupils achieving the expected standard based on mock SATs results and accurate teacher predictions increased across the board in Reading, Maths and GPS. We are exceptionally proud of all the hard work undertaken by the children and staff and the results are a testament to their care and commitment. Throughout the year we watched our children not only progress academically but grow into confident, successful individuals. They have had the opportunity to take part in many enriching activities i.e. school trips, drama performances, Cultural Day celebrations and sporting events which have all promoted their holistic development. Our children, their families and staff ended the year with a fantastic celebratory picnic and we were able to wish them all the very best of luck for their secondary careers.

Our Year 11 Success

This year we once again celebrated phenomenal success in our Year 11's GCSE results. Building upon the accomplishments of the last few years, the KS4 results are a true reflection of pupils' hard work and determination in the face of challenging times, and a testament to the high standards of teaching and support of our staff body.

Despite the circumstances, the percentage of pupils achieving top grades and strong subject performances remains impressive; with 74% having attained 9-4 grades including English and Maths and 56% achieving 9-5. Subject highlights include:

- 90% of pupils achieved 9-4 in English Language and 88% in English Literature
- 76% of pupils achieved 9-4 in Mathematics
- 100% of pupils achieved 9-5 in Biology, Chemistry and Physics
- 80% and above of pupils achieved 9-4 in Art, Business Studies, Computer Science, Film Studies, History, Product Design and Textiles.

In addition to exceptional performance across a wide range of subjects, we have seen some outstanding individual performances:

Learning for All

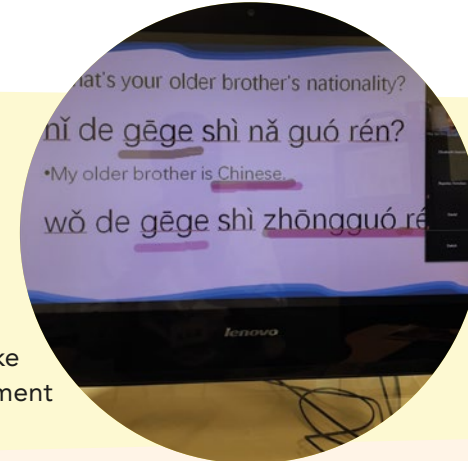

Languages in Lockdown

Learning a language is an exceptional ability, which for our pupils can enhance their CV's and university applications and develop their social skills amongst many other benefits. Throughout lockdown, our Year 7 Grammar+ pupils have continued with their Mandarin lessons and have continued to make excellent progress, learning new phrases and displaying an excellent commitment to their learning.

Supporting Our Catholic Community

The past few months have been an exceptional time in the world; and we placed great emphasis on continuing to support the pastoral and spiritual needs of all members of our community. As such, our home learning timetable incorporated Collective Worship every morning, affording pupils, parents and carers the opportunity to prepare their minds for the day ahead. In addition, our weekly Chaplaincy newsletters included an array of information on how our families could continue to lead a purposeful and active prayer life at home and facilitate opportunities for silent reflection. We also held our first ever live streamed Mass at the end of term!



Getting Back to School

Prior to the summer holidays commencing, we slowly began a phased return to school for some of our year groups across primary and secondary phase.

Science is a practical subject at St Matthew Academy, and our pupils love to learn through experiments and investigations, such as the hurricane in a bottle investigation taking place here. Following an experiment, pupils write up their method, predictions and results, but getting hands on and putting their theory into practise is almost always the favourite method of learning.



We really believe in engaging all of our pupils with current affairs and issues that are affecting their world. Here, you can see how five of our key worker children made their voices heard as part of the Black Lives Matter movement by taking part in the Shout it Out challenge. They had to think deeply about the importance of self-appreciation and making everyone's voices heard.



Secondary phase pupils got back into their photography lessons by practising and refining their skills in the classroom, whilst our Media Scholars and Year 11 music pupils created a virtual tour of the school for open event season and our next cohort of pupils.



Year 1 pupils have been reading books about under the sea, and to put their learning into practise, they decided to create their own story boxes, using art materials to create an ocean backdrop and sea creatures, linked to their learning. Fantastic work!
